

The Library is excited to sponsor your poster printing for the upcoming graduate student research event at UTM.

The library will cover the cost of printing ONE free poster on regular poster grade paper.

## BE AWARE that for this event there are specific requirements that apply to printing your poster.

- a) Your poster must be submitted in **PDF** format.
- b) Your poster must be sized at 42 by 36 inches OR 106.68 by 91.44 centimeters.
- c) It is <u>your</u> responsibility to proofread your final poster before submitting it for printing (there is no second free printing). Email <u>posters@utoronto.ca</u> and attach the final version for printing to this email. You will be emailed twice; once with a confirmation of receipt and again when your printed poster is ready for pick up. Please label your attachment with your lastname\_firstname to avoid confusion.
- d) Your poster MUST be submitted by Sunday April 26, 2015 at 5 pm. The reason for this submission date is to allow sufficient time for printing all of the submitted posters. Posters submitted after the deadline are not eligible for free printing and you will receive an email with the price prior to the poster being printed.
- e) It is strongly requested that you use a light background.
- f) Your final poster will be printed on poster presentation grade poster paper. The library DOES NOT LAMINATE THE POSTERS.



A few more pieces of information:

- Make sure to set your page size (or slide size in PowerPoint) to 42 by 36 inches OR
  106.68 by 91.44 centimeters to ensure maximum resolution.
